AMM welcomes special guests from Nicaragua

The AMM welcomed some special guests during the week of August 11, when *Julia de la Cruz Mena Rivera*, *María Elena Guerra Gallardo* and *Jonathan Gonzalez Rosales* from the Association of Municipalities of Nicaragua ([AMUNIC](#)) visited Canada.

The visit was a continuation of a relationship that began back in 2010, when AMM Executive Director Joe Masi, as part of a larger delegation, visited Nicaragua at the invitation of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM). The purpose of the trip was to work with AMUNIC on various issues.

AMUNIC is very interested in growing its lobbying efforts but lacks the necessary resources. Since AMM had already done work in the region with El Salvador's municipal association, [COMURES](#), the opportunity seemed to be a good fit for the AMM.

A follow-up visit in late 2013 focused on the functions of the Municipalities Trading Company of Manitoba Ltd. (MTCML), and this year, finding ways to generate revenue opportunities for AMUNIC continued to be a priority for the group.

The exchange not only gives the AMM's Nicaraguan counterparts the chance to see how the AMM operates, but also gives the AMM the opportunity to showcase its work to an international audience

Ms. de la Cruz Mena Rivera is the mayor of Granada, Nicaragua, as well as the former vice-president of Nicaragua. Riviera told the *Steinbach Carillon* the experience in Manitoba was wonderful. "We are learning a lot and obviously it's always very important to see the experience of those that are ahead of us and especially to help us as a developing country."

During their time with the AMM, the group met with various elected officials, including Mayor *Chris Goertzen*, City of Steinbach, Councillor *Devi Sharma*, City of Winnipeg and The Honourable *Dave Chomiak*, Minister of Mineral Resources.

"Something we have learned from our experience with both El Salvador and Nicaragua is despite the obvious differences between our municipal challenges, there are nearly as many similarities," said President *Doug Dobrowolski*.

"Those elected to leadership positions are there because they care about their communities and want to make a difference in the lives of their citizens, just the same as here."

The exchange is part of FCM International and is funded by the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA).
