Canada-Manitoba Integrated Bilateral Agreement

On June 4, 2018, the federal and provincial governments announced the signing of the Canada-Manitoba Integrated Bilateral Agreement that will provide more than \$1.1 billion in federal funding over the next decade for our province. At the June District meetings, the Manitoba Strategic Infrastructure Secretariat delivered a presentation on this new funding to support municipal infrastructure projects.

Manitoba Housing - revised Social Housing Rental Program application form

Manitoba Housing has recently made a number of important updates to the Social Housing Rental Program application, based on feedback received from clients and service providers since June, 2017.

We encourage you to share this information with your staff and your clients where applicable.

The revisions to the Social Housing Rental Program application will provide clarity to clients and service providers and will improve the process of serving Manitoban's in need of Social Housing.

Below are the key changes to the application:

- The Special Circumstances section has been expanded to provide clarity for applicants while enabling Manitoba Housing to more accurately assess their need for housing.
- The Preferred Locations section better aligns with the city of Winnipeg map to assist applicants when selecting where they would like to live.
- Applicant signatures are now required in two sections of the application:
- Consent and Declaration section allows Manitoba Housing to share personal information and to release or exchange information to determine eligibility for rental housing including conducting background checks to verify that the information provided on the form is accurate.
- Consent to Release Income Information section authorizes Manitoba Housing to collect income information from Canada Revenue Agency to verify program eligibility.
- The Understanding the Social Housing Rental Program and Application Process section includes additional information to explain eligibility for multiple families to live within a unit.
- Added space for an additional co-applicant in the event there are multiple families within the household.

Important:

Applicants who have completed the 2017 Social Housing Rental Program application form are not required to resubmit.

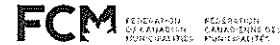
