#### CRITICAL ISSUES - REQUIRE IMMEDIATE ACTION

#### Alternate Revenue Sources

o Manitoba Finance

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Identify new sources of revenue for municipalities to address the infrastructure deficit and their increasing responsibilities.

### Cell Service and High Speed Internet

o Manitoba Innovation, Energy and Mines

The AMM recommends the government:

Assist municipalities in the development of solutions to expand reliable emergency communications, cell service and high speed internet access to all Manitoban communities.

## Economic Development Support

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide a replacement program for Regional Development Corporations, whose operating grants were discontinued in 2012;
- Provide sufficient notice to Regional/Community Development Corporations of any changes in their funding or loan repayments to allow them time to budget accordingly.

## Housing Shortage

o Manitoba Housing and Community Development

The AMM recommends the government:



- Provide funding to support the recommendations of the Rental Housing Supply Roundtable to increase the supply of affordable housing, including rental housing, throughout Manitoba;
- Provide funding to support various forms of seniors' housing across the province.
- Infrastructure Funding New National Program
  - o Manitoba Finance, Manitoba Local Government

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Keep its commitment to provide a share of funding for the federal government's national, long-term infrastructure plan to be introduced in the 2013 Budget.
- Mandatory Police Boards
  - o Manitoba Justice

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Provide funding to cover all operating costs for municipal police boards required under *The Police Services Act*.
- Removal of Community Capital Contributions for Health Facilities
  - o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Fund all health facilities provincially without the current requirement for a local contribution covering 10 per cent of the project costs.
- Recreation Centre Operating Costs
  - o Manitoba Healthy Living, Seniors and Consumer Affairs

The AMM recommends the government:



Support energy efficiency improvement programs and work with Manitoba Hydro to develop a rate structure to assist recreation centres with increasing energy costs.

## Rural Airports

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation

The AMM recommends the government:

- Reinstate a capital assistance program for airports on a 50-50 basis with municipalities;
- ❖ Increase the amount of operating grants for rural paved and unpaved airports, which have remained at \$2,400 and \$1,200 respectively, for at least ten years.

## Rural Water Pipeline Funding

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Establish a commitment of \$10 million annually towards rural water pipeline expansion, as the provincial share of a \$30 million tri-level funding initiative;
- ❖ Identify rural water pipeline funding as a provincial priority under the Growing Forward 2 Agreement with Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada.

# Veterinary Board Funding

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

- Reinstate the Technical Enhancement Grant to provide assistance with equipment costs;
- ❖ Increase funding for operating costs to keep rural veterinarian salaries competitive and to enable rural clinics to continue providing veterinary services to their communities.



### **NEW ISSUES**

- Coal Use in Manitoba
  - o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Extend the date for banning coal use past January 1, 2014;
- Provide additional incentives to Manitobans to assist with the conversion of coal-reliant systems to alternate energy sources.
- Support for LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) Data Collection
  - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide funding to support the acquisition of LiDAR coverage in partnership with local governments.
- Tax Exemption for Municipalities
  - o Manitoba Finance

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Include municipalities as exempt entities under Section 113(2) of *The Tax* Administration and Miscellaneous Taxes Act to exempt them from paying land transfer tax.



## ONGOING ISSUES - SOME PROGRESS, MORE ACTION NEEDED

- Surface Water Management Strategy
  - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

Provide sufficient funding to develop and implement this strategy, and to support new or expanded programs to fulfill the surface water management strategy objectives.

- Noxious Weed Control
  - o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Allocate additional resources to provincial weed control, and support Weed Districts in their weed control efforts.
- Ecological Goods and Services Policy for Manitoba
  - o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives

The AMM recommends the government:

Implement a province-wide Ecological Goods and Services (EG&S) Policy with corresponding funding as soon as possible.

- Libraries
  - o Manitoba Culture, Heritage and Tourism

The AMM recommends the government:

- Establish funding for a universal, province-wide library card system;
- ❖ Increase overall funding for libraries from \$8.50 to at least \$10.00 per capita.



### Tourism Funding

o Manitoba Culture, Heritage and Tourism

The AMM recommends the government:

Maintain support for vibrant communities by continuing to provide funding to promote tourism in Manitoba.

## Reduction of Education Tax on Property

o Manitoba Education

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Identify sustainable new mechanisms that allow all school divisions to reduce their reliance on property taxes to fund education.
- Fulfill election promises to eliminate education taxes on farmland and for seniors:
- Exempt public library properties from education taxes.

### Flood Compensation and Mitigation

o Manitoba Emergency Measures

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide compensation to municipalities and individuals in a timely manner for assessment and income losses to due to flooding;
- ❖ Take responsibility for emergency volunteer workers compensation claims to avoid an artificial increase in the Workers Compensation Board of Manitoba levy for certain municipalities;
- Provide funding for the improvement of flood prevention infrastructure;
- ❖ Make improvements to flood response and mitigation capabilities based on the reviews of 2011 flooding.



- Business Development and Retention
  - o Manitoba Entrepreneurship, Training and Trade

The AMM recommends the government:

- Work with communities in all areas of Manitoba to promote and retain local businesses through training and development initiatives.
- Increase Shelter Allowance Rate (RentAid)
  - o Manitoba Entrepreneurship, Training and Trade

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Increase funding available under RentAid to ensure those in need are able to secure adequate and affordable accommodation.
- Accessibility Legislation
  - Manitoba Family Services and Labour

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Determine costs and provide funding for all feasible upgrades to infrastructure to meet any proposed accessibility standards.
- Funding for Child Care
  - o Manitoba Family Services and Labour

The AMM recommends the government:

- Invest in initiatives to address ongoing staff shortages of child care workers;
- Continue the implementation of the Family Choices agenda for early learning and child care to increase the number of available child care spaces across Manitoba.



## Health Practitioner Recruitment, Training and Retention

o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- Continue to fund existing initiatives to help attract and retain health professionals in rural and northern Manitoba and ensure every Manitoban has a family doctor by 2015;
- ❖ Commit the resources necessary to implement the recommendations of the Brandon Medical Education Study within a reasonable timeframe to address the severe shortage of doctors in rural and northern Manitoba.
- Centralization of Rural Ambulance Services
  - o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide funding to ensure emergency response services are located a reasonable distance from every community to ensure the safety of all Manitobans.
- Funding for Palliative Care Services
  - o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide full funding for local palliative care services.
- Health Ombudsman Position
  - o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Establish a dedicated Health Ombudsman office, with appropriate funding, for the resolution of health complaints and systemic reviews of Manitoba's Regional Health Authorities.



## Costs of Survey Monument Restoration

o Manitoba Healthy Living, Seniors and Consumer Affairs

The AMM recommends the government:

Allocate adequate funding to cover survey monument restoration program costs.

## Intercity Bus Service

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation

The AMM recommends the government:

Provide funding to support community-sponsored options for intercity bus service in rural and northern Manitoba.

### Transportation Infrastructure

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide sufficient funding to maintain and renew provincial roads and urban highways, including:
  - Highways with safety issues (Highway #6);
  - ➤ Highways important for trade and travel (Highway #75);
  - Merging lanes on provincial roads.

#### Oil Production Issues

Manitoba Innovation, Energy and Mines

The AMM recommends the government:

Support municipalities affected by oil production through a regional economic development plan to address municipal challenges such as local infrastructure deterioration and high survey monument restoration costs.



## Mining Issues in Northern Manitoba

o Manitoba Innovation, Energy and Mines

The AMM recommends the government:

Support resource-based communities and municipalities in their development of long-term sustainability plans.

## By-law Enforcement

o Manitoba Justice

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide additional funding to support improved training of municipal by-law enforcement officers;
- ❖ Allocate resources to implement the recommendations of the By-law Enforcement Working Group once they are finalized to reduce municipal enforcement costs and ensure municipalities can achieve compliance with their by-laws.



#### SUCCESSFUL PROGRAMS - MORE FUNDING NEEDED

## Community Museums

o Manitoba Culture, Heritage and Tourism

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Increase funding to the Community Museum Grants Program and reevaluate funding for the Signature Museum Program to ensure museums remain sustainable.

### Community Places Program

- o Manitoba Housing and Community Development
- ❖ The AMM appreciates the increase to the maximum grant amount of up to \$75,000 for the Community Places Program North; however this excludes The Pas, Thompson and Flin Flon.
- ❖ Funding for the Community Places Program was reduced from \$4.5 million to \$3.9 million in Budget 2011-2012, where it remained for Budget 2012-13.

The AMM recommends the government:

Provide additional funding for the highly successful Community Places Program to allow an increase in the maximum funding available and an increased number of recipients.

## Dutch Elm Disease Management Program

o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

Reinstate permanent funding for Dutch Elm Disease management services for municipalities who request them.



## Hometown Green Team Program

o Manitoba Children, Youth and Opportunities

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Increase funding for this program to allow the approval of more applications.

## Funding for Conservation Districts

o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Increase funding to CDs and consider reevaluating the funding formula.

## Mobility Disadvantaged Transportation Program

- o Manitoba Local Government
- ❖ The AMM appreciates the \$1 million in operating and capital funding provided by the Province to 69 communities; however the costs to deliver handi-transit services continue to increase.

The AMM recommends the government:

Increase the maximum grant amount available and total funding for the program.

### Municipal Bridge Renewal Program

- o Manitoba Local Government
- The AMM appreciates the \$75,000 from this program recently allocated to engineering assessments for municipal bridges to prepare them for future infrastructure funding.

The AMM recommends the government:

Continue to support bridge repair and replacement.



- Problem Beaver Management Program
  - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

- Continue to provide funding for targeted beaver management and higher beaver tag rates;
- \* Review options for maximizing the available resources in the program;
- Continue to administer the program provincially.
