CRITICAL ISSUES - REQUIRE IMMEDIATE ACTION

- Alternate Revenue Sources
 - o Manitoba Finance

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Identify new sources of revenue for municipalities to address the infrastructure deficit and increasing municipal responsibilities.
- Building Canada 2014
 - o Manitoba Finance, Manitoba Municipal Government

The AMM recommends the government:

- Support AMM input in the decision-making process for any application-based infrastructure funding;
- ❖ Ensure municipalities receive a fair share of the new Building Canada Fund in consultation with the AMM;
- Recognize the unique needs of small communities in program design in consultation with the AMM.
- Provincial Sales Tax Rebate for Municipalities
 - o Manitoba Finance

The AMM recommends the government:

Exempt municipalities from paying PST or provide a rebate of all PST paid by municipalities.



Cell Service and High Speed Internet Access

o Manitoba Jobs and the Economy, Manitoba Mineral Resources

The AMM recommends the government:

- Continue facilitating discussions with cell carriers and other stakeholders to explore options to expand cellular coverage and broadband access;
- Meet with the federal government and municipalities to develop solutions to ensure the safety of emergency responders and the public in Manitoba.

Community Places Program

- o Manitoba Housing and Community Development
- ❖ Funding for the Community Places Program was reduced by \$600,000 in Budget 2013-14.

The AMM recommends the government:

Provide additional funding for the highly successful Community Places Program to allow an increase in the maximum funding available and an increased number of recipients.

Funding for Conservation Districts

o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Increase funding to CDs to the funding level received prior to the 2013 cuts at a minimum, and consider reevaluating the funding formula.

Problem Beaver Management Program

 Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship; Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development



- Maintain provincial responsibility for problem wildlife and reinstate funding for the Problem Beaver Management Program;
- ❖ Reinstate funding and uphold agreements for beaver management pilot projects with participating municipalities.

Modernize Education Funding

Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide new, sustainable long-term funding to cover 80 per cent of operating costs for education to reduce school division reliance on property taxes;
- Reinstate Tax Incentive Grant funding;
- Fulfill election promises to eliminate school taxes on farmland and for seniors.

Removal or Reduction of Community Contributions for Health Facilities

o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Fund all health facilities provincially without the current requirement for a local contribution covering 10 per cent of the project cost; or
- * Reduce the required community capital contribution to a fixed 5 per cent.

Rural Airports

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation

- Reinstate a capital assistance program for airports on a 50-50 basis with municipalities;
- ❖ Increase the amount of operating grants for rural paved and unpaved airports, which have remained at \$2,400 and \$1,200 respectively, for at least ten years.



Rural Water Pipeline Funding

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Identify rural water pipeline funding as a provincial priority either under the Growing Forward 2 Agreement or with Infrastructure Canada.

Support for Recreation Centre Operating Costs

 Manitoba Healthy Living and Seniors, Manitoba Children and Youth Opportunities

The AMM recommends the government:

Support the development of a pilot project to increase the efficiency of older recreation centres.

Veterinary Board Funding

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development

- ❖ Reinstate the Technical Enhancement Grant to provide assistance with equipment costs;
- ❖ Increase funding for operating costs to keep rural veterinarian salaries competitive and to enable rural clinics to continue providing veterinary services to their communities.



ONGOING ISSUES - SOME PROGRESS, MORE ACTION NEEDED

Affordable Housing Shortage

o Manitoba Housing and Community Development

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Fulfill commitments to build additional affordable housing and personal care homes, and provide incentives to build more rental housing.

By-law Enforcement

o Manitoba Justice

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Allocate resources to support the implementation of changes resulting from the new Provincial Offenses Act and The Municipal By-law Enforcement Act.

Emergency Medical Services

o Manitoba Health

- Provide funding to implement the recommendations of the Emergency Medical Services Review;
- Improve response times and address the shortage of paramedics in rural and northern Manitoba.



Flood Compensation and Mitigation

o Manitoba Emergency Measures

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide compensation to municipalities and individuals in a timely manner for assessment and property losses to due to flooding;
- Make improvements to flood response and mitigation capabilities, as well as flood prevention infrastructure, based on the reviews of 2011 flooding.

Health Practitioner Recruitment, Training and Retention

o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

- Continue to fund initiatives to help attract and retain health professionals in rural and northern Manitoba and ensure every Manitoban has a family doctor by 2015;
- ❖ Continue with the implementation of Brandon Medical Education Study recommendations to address the severe shortage of physicians and other health professionals in rural and northern Manitoba.

Palliative Care Services

o Manitoba Health

The AMM recommends the government:

Ensure sufficient funding is provided for palliative care in every RHA to avoid reliance on community fundraising.

Ecological Goods and Services



o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development

The AMM recommends the government:

- Fulfill commitments to provide provincial funding through Growing Forward 2 for Ecological Goods and Services (EG&S).
- Surface Water Management Strategy
 - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

- Consult with municipalities, and provide sufficient funding to fulfill the Surface Water Management Strategy objectives and address inter-jurisdiction flooding and drainage issues.
- Support for LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) Data Collection
 - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide funding to support the acquisition of LiDAR coverage in partnership with local governments.
- Noxious Weed Control
 - o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development

- ❖ Allocate additional resources to provincial weed control, and support Weed Districts in their weed control efforts.
- Land Use Planner Positions
 - o Manitoba Municipal Government



❖ Fill vacancies to ensure all areas of the province have access to land use planning support, and review development plans in a timely manner.

Libraries

o Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection

The AMM recommends the government:

- Establish funding for a universal, province-wide library card system;
- ❖ Increase overall funding for libraries from \$8.50 to at least \$10.00 per capita.

Tourism Funding

o Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection

The AMM recommends the government:

- Maintain support for vibrant communities by continuing to provide funding to promote tourism in Manitoba.
- Costs of Survey Monument Restoration
 - o Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection

The AMM recommends the government:

Allocate adequate funding to cover survey monument restoration program costs.

Intercity Bus Service

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation



Provide support to community-sponsored options for intercity bus service in rural and northern Manitoba.

Transportation Infrastructure

o Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation

The AMM recommends the government:

- Provide sufficient funding to maintain and renew provincial roads, including gravel roads, access roads and urban highways, particularly:
 - Highways with safety issues; and
 - Highways important for trade and travel.

Oil Production Issues

Manitoba Mineral Resources

- Support ongoing work by the oil industry and municipalities to jointly address future challenges;
- Commit to act on recommendations made by the Rural Municipality Oil Industry Working Group to address infrastructure and resource use challenges in oilproducing and affected communities once the work is completed.

- Mining Issues in Northern Manitoba
 - o Manitoba Mineral Resources



- Support resource-based communities and municipalities in their development of long-term sustainability plans.
- Tax Exemption for Municipalities
 - o Manitoba Finance

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Include municipalities as exempt entities under Section 113(2) of *The Tax***Administration and Miscellaneous Taxes Act to exempt them from paying land transfer tax.

SUCCESSFUL INITIATIVES - MORE FUNDING NEEDED



- Municipal Bridge Renewal Program
 - o Manitoba Municipal Government
 - ❖ The AMM appreciates the \$75,000 from this program allocated to engineering assessments for municipal bridges to prepare them for future infrastructure funding as well as the commitment in Budget 2013 to provide another \$1 million for this program.

- Continue to support bridge repair and replacement.
- Community Museums
 - Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection

The AMM recommends the government:

- ❖ Increase funding to the Community Museum Grants Program and reevaluate funding for the Signature Museum Program to ensure museums remain sustainable.
- Dutch Elm Disease Management Program
 - o Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Make funding available for Dutch Elm Disease management services for municipalities who request these services.

- Hometown Green Team Program
 - o Manitoba Children, and Youth Opportunities



Increase funding for this program to allow the approval of more applications.

Handi-Transit

 Manitoba Municipal Government, Manitoba Healthy Living and Seniors

The AMM recommends the government:

- Increase the maximum grant amount available and total funding for the program;
- ❖ Ensure people with mobility issues have reliable and affordable transportation options, particularly when they need to travel to medical appointments.

Partner 4 Growth Program

o Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Development

The AMM recommends the government:

❖ Expand the successful Partner 4 Growth program to provide more economic development funding to communities.
