Minister Meetings Continue

The AMM met with the Honourable **Steve Ashton**, Minister of Infrastructure and Transportation, on February 19.

Infrastructure funding was the first item on the agenda. The AMM expressed appreciation for the municipal roads program, but reiterated the need for more funding for municipal roads and infrastructure.

The AMM also asked how much of a share of the New Building Canada Fund (NBCF) the province will use for provincial infrastructure. Minister Ashton said the Province didn't apply for any projects yet. The AMM also asked for more investments in maintenance of roads/highways. The Province is looking at new technologies to stretch funding.

Funding for rural airports, railway abandonment, flood mitigation, inter-city bus

service, crown lands and municipal development, roadside maintenance, and the Port of Churchill were also discussed with Minister Ashton.

The next meeting took place on February 25, with the Honourable Ron Kostyshyn, Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Development.

After several years of lobbying the AMM was pleased to see rural water pipeline funding included in Growing Forward II. Yet the funding is significantly lower than before and it will only cover the agriculture-related portion of any project. Funding will be administered by the Water Services Board.

Ecological Goods and Services will also be funded under GF2. Conservation districts are important and the Minister suggested that CDs and AMM should have the same messaging on some of the issues important to both.

On the Partner 4 Growth program, the AMM acknowledged it works well, but requires more funding as it replaced economic development funding, but not to the same level.

Beaver Program funding, noxious weeds, rural veterinary board funding and support for biomass energy were also discussed with the Minister.•

New Building Canada Fund launched

n March 28, the Government of Canada launched the New Building Canada Fund (NBCF). It is worth a total of \$14 billion over 10 years, and will include 3 components:

- A national infrastructure component with \$4 billion
- A provincial infrastructure component with \$10 billion
- A Small Communities Fund with 10% of the provincial component, or \$1 billion

In total, Manitoba will receive \$467 million over 10 years.

The Small Communities Fund is for communities with fewer than 100,000 people. Municipal projects are eligible

under either of these components, as long as they meet the conditions and fall under the approved categories. For instance, the National Infrastructure Component can include municipal projects in the eligible areas if they have "national significance."

There have been some major changes to project categories under the Building Canada Fund. For instance, local roads and sport/recreation/culture and tourism infrastructure have been removed. There is also a new category called "innovation" which applies to things like infrastructure for research in post-secondary institutions. This means universities and others will now be competing for infrastructure dollars.

In addition, the maximum federal contribution to municipal projects can't exceed 1/3 of the funding, including the Gas Tax. This means municipalities can't use their Gas Tax Funding as their 1/3rd share. Without a source of alternate revenue this is a concern.

Although the NBCF has officially launched, a number of outstanding issues still need to be addressed. The AMM will continue to update members as information becomes available.•
