Court Challenge

The AMM's legal proceeding challenging the Province's implementation of the Municipal Amalgamations Act was heard in Court of Queen's Bench this week.

The challenge is directed at two aspects of the amalgamation process:

- We asked the Court to ensure the procedure the Province must follow to consider amalgamating municipalities under the Amalgamations Act is fair and transparent for municipalities and their residents;
- We challenged the Province of Manitoba's decision, before the December 1, 2013 deadline, that certain groupings of municipalities will be amalgamated.

Court of Queen's Bench Justice Robert Dewar heard our case and has reserved judgment, meaning he wants to take some time to think about the case. He did not indicate how long he will take to make a decision.

The AMM will advise members as soon as we are notified of the decision.

MPI Increase

Each year, municipalites receive a rate increase for basic and complex fire fighting payments made by Manitoba Public Insurance (MPI). This increase is based on the prior year's C.P.I. plus 1% and is effective as of March 1.

This year, the basic call rate will increase from \$726 to \$749, and the complex call rate will increase from \$968 to \$999 based on the 2013 Manitoba C.P.I. rate of 2.2% (resulting in a 3.2% increase).•

2014 Provincial Budget Highlights

In the March 6 provincial budget, the Province of Manitoba made progress on some important files for municipalities.

BUDGET 2014 POSITIVES

- The \$7 million Municipal Road Improvement Program (MRIP) will be topped up by \$3 million, for a total investment of \$10 million per year for 5 years (application-based and cost-shared 50/50 with municipalities).
- 2. The Municipal Bridge Program was renewed and will get \$1 million per year for 5 years.
- The Manitoba Water Services Board received a top-up of another \$2 million per year for 5 years. municipalities.

The AMM is also awaiting details on the new Building Canada Plan, and lobbying the Province to ensure at least 70% of the BCF is dedicated to municipalities.

Other highlights:

- Support for handi-transit services is expected to increase by almost \$200,000.
- The investment in the Partner 4 Growth Program has doubled.
- Main market roads will receive \$2.75 million per year over 5 years.
- More Green Team jobs for students have been added.

BUDGET 2014 NEGATIVES

- 1. Despite doubling funding for the Partners for Growth Program, the elimination of this funding two years ago means it is still only half of what it was in 2012.
- 2. Municipalities must still pay P.S.T. on municipal infrastructure projects.
- 3. Municipalities are still without a dedicated form of alternate revenue.

The AMM will continue to track this year's budget and will update our members as new information is discovered.•
