Target Audience: Employees working in the business and government sectors who possess limited knowledge of the history, culture and experiences of Indigenous peoples in Canada.

Description

The 2-day workshop will build participants' understanding of the historic context of Treaties and Treaty Relationships, and the relevance of Treaties today, including their connection to present-day issues such as land disputes and the Idle No More movement. Participants will unpack misconceptions and stereotypes about First Nations peoples, and learn practical strategies to address and undo them. Participants can expect to leave this workshop with a richer appreciation of the diverse cultures, traditions and daily lives of Indigenous peoples and Nations, and a deeper understanding of how all Manitobans can be effective and engaged Treaty Partners.
