Transport Canada - Call for Proposals Program to Enhance Rail Safety Engagement

<u>Program to Enhance Rail Safety Engagement</u> supports Indigenous and local communities to participate in rail safety initiatives in Canada. The program provides funding in the form of a contribution to a maximum of \$150,000 per recipient and per application.

The call for proposals will remain open until **February 16, 2023**

This program is intended to provide financial capacity support for resources to participate in eligible activities such as:

- Holding discussions to address gaps in Indigenous and local engagement on rail safety
- Engaging at the local and regional level on Indigenous and local communities' representation in rail safety
- Researching the impact rail lines have on communities or traditional territories.


