FleetNet Replacement Project

Manitoba has entered into a publicly tendered agreement with Bell Mobility Inc. (Bell) for a new Public Safety Communications Service (PSCS). The PSCS will provide a modern mobile radio service for public safety and public service organizations in Manitoba, and will replace the Very High Frequency radio network used by Manitoba Sustainable Development.

Over 99% of Manitobans live in the areas that will be covered by the PSCS. Engineered to be highly reliable, the PSCS is based on modern communications standards and will be built with modern infrastructure and equipment. Implementation of the PSCS infrastructure, and transition of public safety and public service users to the new service, will take up to three years (i.e., from fiscal year 2018/19 to 2020/2021). It is anticipated that municipalities will start transitioning to the PSCS beginning in 2020.

Re:Trade Compliance Issue

OUR RESPONSIBILITY:

The new regulations by the Canada Free Trade Agreement (CFTA) and the Northwest Partnership Trade Agreement (NWPTA) require any buying group, such as the Trading Company, to complete Request for Proposals (RFP) for any supplier with sales over 75,000.00. The RFP is posted on Merx.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY: Read and follow steps at : Notice of Planned Procurement

Being Trade compliant is IMPORTANT with stiffer penalties for Infractions

CFTA increased the level of financial penalties that can be imposed in cases where governments act against the agreement. The fines are tied to population, and while the Agreement on Internal Trade's maximum penalty was \$5 million, the new maximum fine is \$10 million.'
