Government of Canada launches fund to better protect Canadian communities against natural disasters

The Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund (DMAF) is a 10-year national program that will invest \$2 billion in projects that help communities better withstand natural hazards such as floods, wildfires, seismic events and droughts. DMAF will support large-scale infrastructure projects with a minimum cost of \$20 million like diversion channels, wetland restorations, wildfire barriers and setback levees.

Municipalities are eligible applicants, and those wishing to be considered for funding under the program will have until July 31, 2018, to submit an Expression of Interest to Infrastructure Canada.

Below are the key changes to the application:

- The Special Circumstances section has been expanded to provide clarity for applicants while enabling Manitoba Housing to more accurately assess their need for housing.
- The Preferred Locations section better aligns with the city of Winnipeg map to assist applicants when selecting where they would like to live.
- Applicant signatures are now required in two sections of the application:
- Consent and Declaration section allows Manitoba Housing to share personal information and to release or exchange information to determine eligibility for rental housing including conducting background checks to verify that the information provided on the form is accurate.
- Consent to Release Income Information section authorizes
 Manitoba Housing to collect income information from Canada
 Revenue Agency to verify program eligibility.
- The Understanding the Social Housing Rental Program and Application Process section includes additional information to explain eligibility for multiple families to live within a unit.
- Added space for an additional co-applicant in the event there are multiple families within the household.

Important:

Applicants who have completed the 2017 Social Housing Rental Program application form are not required to resubmit.

Please ensure that clients are directed to utilize the most recent version of the Social Housing Rental Program Application
