UPDATE - Important Information regarding Federal Grade Crossings Compliance and Safety

Under the federal <u>Grade Crossings Regulation</u>, municipalities share responsibility for managing the safety at federally-regulated grade crossings. Existing federally-regulated grade crossings must meet the requirements of the Regulations by November 28, 2021.

To better prepare for this compliance requirement, the AMM requested Transport Canada to provide helpful links and resources to better assist municipalities. In response, Transport Canada has provided the <u>attached document</u>, which is a summary of information from its website.

In May 2018, the federal government announced the \$13.2 billion NHCF, a federally administered program under the National Housing Strategy, which requires either provincial, municipal or Indigenous governments to co-invest (monetary or in-kind) in order for housing providers to access federal funding.

As the decades-old FleetNet emergency communications system is currently being replaced, municipalities will start transitioning

to the new Public Safety Communications Service (PSCS) in 2020.

Engineered to be highly reliable, the PSCS is based on modern communications standards and will be built with modern infrastructure and equipment.

Please note municipalities are required to purchase radios a n d corresponding equipment. The Province of Manitoba has committed to fully fund the annual operating costs on behalf of municipalities.
