The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act

Manitoba has a new law to make communities and neighbourhoods safer.

The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act is the first of its kind in Canada.

It works by holding property owners accountable for threatening or disturbing activities that regularly take place on their property related to:

- Unlawful drug use, dealing, production or cultivation
- · Prostitution and related activities
- Unlawful sale of liquor
- Unlawful use or sale of intoxicating substances non-potable and solvent-based products
- Sexual abuse or exploitation of a child or related activities
- Possession or storage of an unlawful firearm, weapon or explosive
- Participation in a Criminal Organization offence

The act refers to activities that are ongoing, not those happening occasionally.

Community Energy Efficiency Program



Efficiency Manitoba will be accepting funding applications for the <u>Community Energy Efficiency Program</u> from **September 1 to November 30**, **2021**. This program offers municipalities the opportunity, support, and resources to hire an energy efficiency advocate to create and implement community energy efficiency plans with guidance from Efficiency Manitoba's team of experts.

These plans help communities lower their overall energy consumption by enabling participation in Efficiency Manitoba's programs for energy efficiency upgrades. Hired by the municipality, the energy efficiency advocate helps foster a culture of conservation in the community, empowering its citizens to participate in energy-saving initiatives. Community participation in energy efficiency programs will lead to energy and bill savings in the municipality's homes and businesses.

Efficiency Manitoba pays for **80%** of the advocate's salary up to a **maximum of \$40,000 each year for two years**. Frequent and direct access to Efficiency Manitoba's program staff and technical experts is provided, assisting with energy efficiency training.
