

Methodology

Between April 5 and 9, 2024, Probe Research surveyed a random and representative sampling of 800 adults residing in Manitoba. Those who responded to the survey are members of Probe Research's online panel, as well as members of another national online panel.

Because an online panel is a non-probability sample, no margin of error can be ascribed. For the purposes of comparison, a probabilistic sample of N=800 Manitoba adults would have a margin of error of ± 3.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error would also be higher within each of the survey's population sub-groups.

Minor statistical weighting has been applied to this sample to ensure that age and gender characteristics properly reflect known attributes of the province's population. All data analysis was performed using SPSS statistical analysis software.

The survey instrument was designed by Probe Research in close consultation with the Association of Manitoba Municipalities.

Results may not add up to exactly 100% due to rounding. Numbers of <2% are not shown in the graphs.
