PUBLIC NOTICE – VOTING AS A NON-RESIDENT VOTER

For municipal elections only, non-resident land-owners are eligible to vote in an election. In order to be eligible, the person must be:

- A Canadian citizen;
- At least 18 years of age on Election Day;
- A registered owner of land in the municipality for at least six months on Election Day.

A maximum of two non-resident property owners, per property, are permitted to vote in a municipal election. In order to vote, each of these voters must obtain written consent from a majority of the registered land-owners, and file this with the senior election official. Consent forms can be obtained from the senior election official, and must be presented at the time of voting.

When voting, you may also be required to provide proof of ownership to the voting official. Ensure you bring proof of ownership with you when voting.

- 1. Read carefully these instructions.
- 2. Mark only those marks on the ballot paper you are instructed to make and no other.
- 3. Mark the ballot paper with pencil.
- 4. After you have marked the ballot paper, fold it so as to show only the initials of the voting official on the back of it.
- 5. Do not let any person see how you have marked your ballot paper.
- 6. Insert the ballot into the ballot envelope provided, and seal the ballot envelope.
- 7. Insert the ballot envelope into the certificate envelope and seal it.
- 8. Complete and sign the certificate envelope, indicating that you are a qualified voter, unable to vote either in advance or at the regular voting station on election day.
- 9. Insert the certificate envelope into the outer envelope, which contains the address of the Senior Election Official.
- 10. Ensure the envelope is returned to the Senior Election Official by 8:00 p.m. on election day, or your ballot will not be counted.

 - If voter provides ID and takes the oath a ballot may be given
 - If voter does not provide ID and take the oath no ballot is given

Determine and declare results

- Preliminary 'unofficial' results
- Official results
 - SEO must give notice to all candidates
 - Voting official decisions to accept/reject ballot stands
- Safekeeping of election materials / Disposing of ballots

Tie vote

- SEO declares office vacant; and
- Proceed to hold a by-election
 - Unless there was an objection at the count or an application filed for a recount

Judicial Recount

- Tie declared and objection was made to election officials decision to accept or reject a ballot, or
- Application made by voter, or
- Application made by candidate
 - Application to Court of Queen's Bench must be made within 14 day of election day

Challenge the Results - Election or Vote

- Application candidate, voter or SEO
- Grounds limited
- Court procedure heard on an urgent basis
- Court decision may be appealed within 7 days
- Costs determined by judge

QUESTIONS

- Q. Who can be present when ballots are being counted?
- A. Voting official for that station, candidate, no more than 2 scrutineer per candidate and any other person the SEO allows
- Note: at official count 1 scrutineer, per candidate
- Q. May the spouse of a candidate be a scrutineer?
- A. Yes, if appointed by candidate and takes oath

Campaign Financing

- The Municipal Act Sections 93.1(1) to 93.19(2)
- Currently in place for provincial, federal and many municipalities across Canada
- Not applicable to Local Urban District or School Board Elections

Campaign Financing

Who is affected:

- Council
- Candidates
- Senior Election Officials (SEOs)
- Chief Administrative Officers (CAOs)

Campaign Financing

Legislation prescribes:

- Campaign Period
- Registration Period
- Registration with SEO
- Who may contribute
- Individual contribution limits
- Filing of election finance statement with CAO
- Offences

By-law prescribes:

- Campaign expense limit
- Rules for reporting fund-raising events
- Form for the election finance statement
- Date to file election finance statement

Campaign Expense and Contribution By-law

Key features:

- Changes must be adopted before April 27, 2018 (180 days before Election Day) to take effect for 2018 general municipal election
- Date to file election finance statement not more than 210 days following election

Campaign Expense and Contribution By-law

Key features (continued):

- Campaign expense limits
 - Eligible expenses may include:
 - Newspaper advertisements, pamphlets, signs
 - Hall or room rentals
 - Food and refreshments for candidates, campaign workers
 - Travel expenses such as gas

Campaign Expense and Contribution By-law

Key features (continued):

- Rules for reporting fund-raising events
- Campaign contributions:
 - Only residents of Manitoba
 - Union, corporate and anonymous donations banned

Campaign Expense and Contribution By-law

Key features (continued):

- Contribution limits of:
 - \$1,500 per contributor for a Head of council or councillor candidate elected at large
 - \$750 for a councillor candidate elected by wards
 - Same limits apply to candidate and spouse
 - Monetary and non-monetary

Election Finance Statement (5 page document)

- Page 1
 - Candidate's name / contact information
- Page 2
 - Total Contributions
 - Total Expenses
 - Surplus / (Deficit)
- Page 3
 - Individual contributor's names & address if more than \$250.00

- Page 4
 - Fund-Raising Event Statement
- Page 5
 - Loan Details
 - Candidate Declaration statement is accurate disclosure and *The Municipal Act* and Municipality's by–law requirements met.

Election Finance Statement

- Registered candidates must file with CAO within timeframe established in by-law
 - No later than 210 days after election May 22, 2019
- Available to the public
- Penalties for not filing:
 - Elected candidates forfeiture of seat on council
 - Registered but not Nominated or Registered and Nominated but not elected candidates – ineligible for next general election

Recording contributions and expenses:

- All candidates are responsible to keep an accurate record
- Retain records (copies of receipts, cancelled cheques, bank statements) for at least 2 years after the election

Optional by-laws:

- Require election finance statements to be audited.
- Establish tax credits and rebates for campaign contributions.
- Establish a program for reimbursement of campaign expenses.

SEO -Receiving Candidate Registrations

- Public Notice of the date, time & place of when and where registrations will be received
- Ensure that prospective candidates are aware of campaign financing rules


- Q. Candidate is running for councillor and will be contributing \$750 to her campaign. She will not be accepting any other donations. Is a separate bank account required?
- A. No, but candidate must keep track of expenses to properly complete Election Finance Statement
- Q. Using campaign material from previous election – is it an expense?
- A. Probably not (no cash value, fully amortized)

QUESTIONS

- Q. Campaign Finance Statement: Am I required to file when:
 - I registered to run but then withdrew?
 - A. Yes
 - I ran but was not elected?
 - A. Yes
 - I ran and won but did not accept any contributions and had no expenses?
 - A. Yes
- Q. Are donations tax deductible?
- A. No

QUESTIONS

- Q. Campaign Finance Statement How long are receipts to be kept? Do receipts need to be submitted to municipal office?
- A. Two years
- A. No, but must be available on request
- Q. Should Election Finance Statement report a surplus?
- A. No, campaign contributions should equal expenses. Candidates are required to give any surplus to the municipality.
