The Municipal Act

 s. 264 - Every municipality must provide fire protection services within its boundaries to reduce the danger of fire, which may include education programs, inspections of property, the installation of alarms, instructions on fighting fires, the provision of fire fighting equipment and a fire protection force.





Fires Prevention and Emergency Response Act (FPERA)

Municipal Responsibilities under FPERA:

- Adopt the Manitoba Fire Code
- Inspect Prescribed Buildings
- Investigate ALL Fires
- Report All Fires - {Other incidents}
- Incident Management System ICS
- Compliance with FPERA Regulations

Bylaws

- Local Authority's own Fire and Emergency Bylaw
 - What does the department do?
 - To what level? i.e. "How Much?"
- To be part of Mutual Aid Districts and with neighbour Municipalities
- Burning Bans & Permits

- Reciprocating (Specialty, Technical) Services
- Fee-for-Service Agreements with Industry or others

- Time-Critical Services
- Immediate Service Consumption
- Intangible Delivery
- Specialized Training & Equipment
- Labour Intensive
- Transaction Time & Volume







Fire Departments' Role

- Fire Chief is "Local Assistant" to the Fire Commissioner
- Fire Prevention, Inspection & Public Education
- First responder to most emergencies
- Job & training requirements are the same whether paid or volunteer
- Emergencies do not differentiate
