


Key Findings



- 84% of respondents noted that property crime is very/somewhat likely to occur in their municipality.
- 77% of respondents noted that drug crime is very/somewhat likely to occur in their municipality.
- 92% of respondents noted that they are very/somewhat concerned about illicit drug use in their municipality.

- 92% of respondents noted that they are very/somewhat concerned about the lack of police presence.
- 64% of respondents feel that their municipality does not have enough police officers to make community members feel safe.
- 88% of municipalities believe that enhanced police visibility is a priority for 2022 and beyond.

- 95% of respondents noted that they strongly/somewhat believe, provincial cannabis taxation-revenues should be allocated to address public safety and/or fight crime in local communities.
- 90% believe the Province should not be able to replace municipal representatives on police boards with provincial appointees.




How concerned are you of the following activity in your municipality?



If your municipality pays for policing, to what degree have policing costs increased over the last 3 years?






of respondents noted costs were less than 10%

82% of respondents noted that they were unaware.




Which of the following policing priorities do you believe will be important in 2022 and beyond?

Do you feel your municipality has sufficient authority to enforce by-laws?










In your opinion, do you believe the provincial government should be able to replace municipal representatives on police boards with provincial appointees?

AMM Provincial Recommendations


- Assist municipalities with rapidly increasing, unsustainable policing costs;
- Increase support to police services to address increasing rates of property crime and help mitigate illicit drug use in local communities;
- Review the mandate of police boards to allow local Councils more oversight over municipal police forces, including the establishment of police boards on a voluntary basis;
- ✓ Ensure municipalities receive all necessary information regarding the new hub system for *Mental Health Act* patient transfers as well as other Manitoba Justice programs to help address rising crime rates within communities;
- Co-develop a fair cannabis taxation revenue-sharing model to help address public safety issues in local communities; and
- Work collaboratively with the AMM and municipalities to address challenges regarding by-law enforcement.





AMM Federal Recommendations

- Absorb all retroactive costs related to RCMP unionization;
- ✓ Increase funding to the RCMP Depot to recruit, hire and train more cadets;
- Increase funding to allow for more RCMP officers across Manitoba; and
- Provide incentives through the RCMP Reserve Program to encourage reservists to fill temporary vacancies in rural communities.



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
