How We Got Here



- The Speech from the Throne in 2021 committed to developing a seniors strategy so aging Manitobans are able to stay safe in their homes and communities as long as they choose.
- Minister of Seniors and Long-Term Care introduced in January 2022.
- One of the department's priorities was to develop a comprehensive seniors strategy and action plan.
- The department embarked on extensive engagement and consultation with Manitobans on what a seniors strategy should include (Apr - Oct 2022).
- Development of the seniors strategy (Nov 2022 Jan 2023)
- February 22, 2023 launched Manitoba's seniors strategy "Manitoba, A Great Place to Age: Provincial Seniors Strategy"

Input to Seniors Strategy



A comprehensive public engagement process reached seniors and community partners across the province and incorporated diverse voices into the planning process.

- Minister's tour with community roundtables in thirteen (13) communities
- 41 interviews and focus groups with seniors, caregivers, seniors serving organizations and thought leaders
- public surveys on the EngageMB platform that received over 10,000 respondents
- 30 volunteer Community Engagement Networks who facilitated 61 focus groups and discussion in their communities engaging with 900 Manitobans
- relationship development with Indigenous governments and organizations
- workshops with partners from across government

What did we hear?



- Seniors have diverse needs stay in their homes; live with their families; connected to community.
- <u>Life is getting more expensive</u> for Manitobans as they age and who are dealing with issues of inflation, fixed incomes, and the lack of affordable services and supports.
- Gaps in the range of services and supports offered as we age, especially in northern and rural communities.
- Pride in how <u>diverse Manitoba</u> is as a province including Indigenous, francophone and other ethnic and cultural communities. Serving diverse communities required systems that are supportive this diversity.
- Services and supports are challenging to <u>access and navigate</u>.
- People are experiencing <u>increasingly complex care and support needs</u> and this may add strain health system and other community supports.
- <u>Unpaid caregivers</u> are increasingly challenged to manage the complex needs of those for which they care.
- Seniors are often <u>defined as 65 and older</u>, there should be some discretion within community programs.
- Many Manitobans feel valued in their community, but also experience <u>ageism</u> and <u>ableism</u>.

Navigation



- Older Manitobans, caregivers and service providers will be able to access information, programs and services through a single central source and navigation between services will be supported within communities.
 - Empower and activate existing local community groups and resources to be a network of services and supports for seniors and their caregivers
 - Provide a central up-to-date information source on programs and services

High Quality Services



- Older Manitobans will have access to an ecosystem of high quality community-based and health services and supports that support aging in place and meeting diverse needs along a continuum of aging.
