Executive Training!

- Define assimilation and enfranchisement, describe the residential school system and the Indian Act;

- Define self governance, explain the relationship between Indigenous people and The Crown and identify the issues addressed by the Indigenous Law in Canada;
- Define Indigenous rights, treaty rights, and the importance of land claims to Indigenous people;
- Recognize the significance of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the residential school apology, and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action;
