The result?
A turning point in municipal-federal relations

Budget 2016 reaffirms the government's plan to invest \$60 billion in new infrastructure spending over 10 years:

Phase 1 - 2016/17 - 2017/18

\$11.9 billion in new commitments;

Phase 2 - 2018/2019 -

\$48.1 billion, with details to be finalized in the next year.





2016 Federal budget Commitments in key areas advanced by FCM:

- Modernizing Federal Investments in Local Infrastructure
- Public Transit
- Affordable Housing
- Green Infrastructure
- Other:
- Recreation and Cultural Infrastructure
- Public Safety
- Rural and Northern
- Capacity Building:
 - Climate Change & Asset Mgt Capacity Building









Public Transit

\$3.4 billion/3 yrs to upgrade and improve public transit systems (track upgrades, fleet replacements etc.).

- For existing transit systems, based 100% on existing ridership.
- Eligible costs: include design, engineering and planning (costs not previously eligible for federal funding.)





Affordable Housing:

- \$1.48 billion/2 yrs in new funding for affordable housing and homelessness.
- \$574 million/2 yrs new \$\$\$ to support energy and water retrofits, as well as renovations of existing social housing units.
- Up to \$500 million/yr in low-cost loans to municipalities and housing developers (Affordable Rental Housing Financing.)







Green Infrastructure:

- \$2 billion/4 yrs Clean Water and Wastewater Fund for immediate improvements to water distribution and treatment.
 - Projects to be prioritized by provinces and territories, in collaboration with local governments.
- \$518 million for climate change mitigation and adaptation projects over the next five years





Other key investments for communities of all sizes:

- \$500 million for high-speed broadband in rural and small communities
- A 33% increase to the Northern Residents Tax Deduction
- \$323.7 million to enhance public safety, including rail safety
- \$322.2 million for community, recreation and cultural facilities





FCM: A trusted partner of the federal government:

- \$125 million to FCM to deliver to help address climate `change and improve asset mgt at the local level.
- \$125 million to expand environmental innovation through FCM's Green Municipal Fund.





What it means for you: a transformative new approach to the municipal-federal partnership

- Increases to 50% the maximum federal contribution in <u>new</u> infrastructure programs.
- Removes the requirements for a P3 screen giving municipalities more choice and flexibility.
- Commits to accelerating the \$9 billion available under the New Building Canada Fund.
- New Capacity Building Support
