Defining Community Economic Development

Definition

 In the Municipal Act of MB, "economic development" means the establishment, expansion or continuation of a business or industry

Local communities choose <u>deliberate</u> actions to <u>influence</u> the local economy and to improve the <u>quality</u> of life for its residents – includes economic, social and environmental development of the community by the community.



Definition

Community economic development is characterized by communitybased processes and priorities.

It is a process through which development of the community is pursued by the community.

Planning is a central activity and is based on participatory principles of community democracy.

Likewise, appropriate community organizations are developed to respond to the community's priorities and values, and to facilitate the maximum access to the process and the maximum control by the community.

Goals of Community Economic Development

Goals of Community Economic Development

- Create and increase employment
- Retain and grow business
- Increase locally owned business
- Increase investment into the community
- Generate wealth in the community and reduce poverty



Goals of Community Economic Development

- Revitalize and stabilize the local economy
- Nuture local economic linkages
- Improve the physical and social environment
- Improve the quality of life and services in the community



Structures to Deliver CED

If you don't have CED office or staff

- CED usually begins with
 - A group or individual looking for a way to address issues or build on opportunities
 - The spark needs to catch
- What to look for.....
 - Energy and enthusiasm
 - Willingness to invest time and/or money
 - Local government buy in
 - The capacity to carry things through



Volunteer Committee

- No specific legal structure
- Operated by volunteers, rather than staff
- Municipality may or may not provide financial support and committee representatives
- This is where you will often find your community champions



Development Corporation

- Operates as an independent entity
- Functions through a board of directors
 - Sometimes appointed by stakeholder organizations
- May or may not have hired staff
- May be community based or privately owned
- Community Development Corporations (CDC) have a special corporate status in Manitoba and municipalities are "owners".



Within Local Government

- Housed within municipal government structure
- Under the direction of Council
- Assigned staff and budget



Blended

- Board made up of council members and representatives from the community
- Arms-length corporation owned by the Municipality



Funding

- Most funding for economic development is budgeted from the local municipality.
- Share overhead costs with other organizations or by pooling funds with adjacent municipalities.
- Consider business license revenues dedicated to funding CED.



Funding

- Expenses for CED organizations covering multiple jurisdictions can be cost-shared based on property assessment or per capita.
- Arms-length organizations are able to access alternative funding sources. ie income from rent, selling of consultation services and corporate sponsorships.
- Specific project funding may be available from various government agencies.



Roles in Community Economic Development

Roles in CED

- Federal government
 - Community Futures offices
 - international trade
 - funding programs ie Invest Canada Community Initiative, CMHC
- Provincial government
 - Regulator
 - Funding Programs
 - Support and Resources ag sector, housing

Elected Officials' Role in CED

- Municipal Act says:
 - "A Council may encourage economic development"
 - Adopt an economic development strategic plan
 - Give grants (not directly or indirectly reduce or reimburse taxes paid or payable)
 - Partner with another municipality or agency

- Tools
 - Land use planning
 - Bylaws
 - Strategic Planning
 - Process
 - Budget



Roles in CED

- Economic Development Officer
 - Planning
 - Research
 - Networking
 - Mentoring and Advocacy
 - Promotion and Marketing
 - Business Prospecting
 - Business Counselling
 - Monitoring and Measuring Performance

EDO Skills

- clerical skills
- flexibility
- planning expertise
- marketing abilities
