Community Economic Development combines **community** and **economic** development.

It is development of the community by the community.

Communities <u>determine</u> their own solutions to <u>economic</u>, <u>social</u> and <u>environmental</u> issues and <u>opportunities</u> – and <u>act</u> on them!

In other words: local communities choose <u>deliberate</u> actions to <u>influence</u> the local economy and to <u>improve</u> the <u>quality</u> of life for its residents.


